Satisfactory Progress Toward Degree

By the time a student majoring in Spanish has completed 72 semester credits (including transfer, advanced placement, advanced standing, and course withdrawal), the student must have completed satisfactorily the following courses in Spanish: SPAN 3105 Grammar, Composition and Conversation, SPAN 3106 Grammar, Composition and Conversation, SPAN 3304 Introduction to Hispanic Literature, and one of the following: SPAN 3404 Topics in Early Modern Cultures of Spain, SPAN 3414 Topics in Modern Cultures of Spain, SPAN 3414 Topics in Modern Cultures, SPAN 3464 Topics in Modern Mexican and Central American Cultures, SPAN 3474 Topics in Modern Hispanic Caribbean Cultures, SPAN 3484 Topics in Modern Andean and Southern Cone Cultures, SPAN 3494 Introduction to Hispanic Linguistics, SPAN 3514 Spanish for Medical Professions, SPAN 3524 Introduction to Spanish Translation, SPAN 3534 Spanish for Business Professions, SPAN 3544 Sounds of Spanish, SPAN 3554 Teaching

Graduation Requirements Additional Notes

- · Total hours required: 120 credit hours required for graduation
- · All courses are 3 credits.
- Free electives: Complete remaining credit hours needed to satisfy degree requirement of 120 credits.
- Students must earn 36 credit hours for the Spanish major regardless of initial course placement.
- · If you have AP or IB Spanish credit, see your Spanish Advisor.
- GPA requirements: A minimum grade of "C" is required in each of these courses. A minimum overall GPA of 2.0 as well as an in-major GPA of 2.0 are required. All courses listed above are considered inmajor courses.
- Priority is given to Spanish majors and minors for registration in Spanish courses.
- The Department of MCLL accepts CLEP credit for SPAN courses; however, the CLEP test must be taken prior to the student completing a higher language course. Once students successfully complete a VT SPAN course, we do not allow them to go back and take the CLEP test to gain credit for lower-level courses.

Transfer Credit

- Students may transfer no more than 18 of the last 45 credits of coursework. Study Abroad credits fall under this rule if they are not VT-sponsored study abroad programs.
- At least 25% of the 120 hours required for the degree and 25% of the required hours for the major must be completed at VT.
- A form titled "Authorization to Take Courses Elsewhere" must be filled out and signed by the student, Global Education Office, Spanish advisor, and the undergraduate academic dean's office before the student departs on the study abroad program.
- A maximum of 50% of the required credits for a degree may be earned at a two-year college.

Foreign Language Requirement

Students who did not successfully complete at least two years of a single foreign, classical, or sign language during high school must successfully complete six semester hours of a single foreign, classical, or sign language at the college level. Courses taken to meet this requirement do not count toward the hours required for graduation. Please consult the Undergraduate Catalog for details.
